Laffanour I Galerie Downtown Brings Design Masterpieces to MAZE Art Gstaad – Where Timeless Craft Meets Elite Collecting

There are design fairs, and then there's MAZE Art Gstaad – a place where art and design aren't just exhibited, but experienced in the kind of setting that feels more like a collector's dream come to life. This year, from February 14th to 16th, 2025, Laffanour I Galerie Downtown brings its unmatched curation of postwar and contemporary design to the heart of the Swiss Alps, offering a rare chance to acquire pieces that carry both history and soul.

For those in the know, Laffanour isn't just a gallery. Based in Paris, it has long championed the timeless works of Jean Prouvé, Charlotte Perriand, Pierre Jeanneret, and Le Corbusier, preserving the legacy of these 20th-century masters while engaging in a dialogue with today's most intriguing contemporary artists and designers.

Why This Collection Matters - And Why It's Perfect for Gstaad

Laffanour's showcase at MAZE isn't just a display; it's a **statement about what great design is and why it still matters today**. The spotlight is on **Jean Prouvé's legendary stool**, a piece that embodies everything he stood for: industrial innovation, functionality, and effortless beauty. The stool's **embossed aluminum seat in metallic green**, set against **tubular black legs and wooden feet**, feels just as fresh today as it did in the 1950s. And for design obsessives, there's an added layer of intrigue – Prouvé's earlier prototype of this piece, featuring a **star-shaped central leg**, remains locked away in the private collection of his brother, **Pierre Prouvé**.

But this is far from a one-note exhibition. Laffanour's curation extends far beyond France, bringing in the tactile richness of a **pequi wood coffee table by Brazilian master José Zanine Caldas**, the sculptural genius of **Vassilakis Takis**, and the bold artistic explorations of **Richard Texier and Thomas Ruff**. Add to that a selection of **Shaker furniture**, where form meets function with effortless grace, and you have a collection that isn't just aesthetically striking — it tells a story of craftsmanship across time and continents.
